Some low income NHS patients including disabled people can get help with transport costs to and from hospital. Help with travel costs is available if you (or your partner) get:

- ❖ Income Support
- ❖ Income based Job Seekers Allowance
- ❖ Pension Credit Guarantee Credit
- ❖ If you have an NHS tax credit exemption certificate
- ❖ Some war pensioners – if entitlement is connected with pensionable disability
- ❖ People on low income who have certificate HC2 or HC3

For further more detailed information you need a copy of the HC11 'Help with Health Costs' booklet which should be available from the Job Centre, Hospital, Doctor, Dentist, Optician or Pharmacy.

How Do I Claim My Fare?

Good Neighbours Community Transport is not able to claim your travel cost's for you. You must pay the driver the agreed fare and then claim the cost of the fare from the hospital.

Ask your driver for a receipt and take it to the reception desk at the hospital. They will then advise you where the hospital's fare office is located to enable you to claim your refund.

Remember to take along with you evidence of benefit entitlements or exemption certificate HC2 or HC3.

To apply for an exemption certificate you will need to fill out an HC1 form available from:
